

Cowara Bird Story Event 2023 – Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the event? The Amphitheatre in Pioneer Park, Cowaramup (where the Sundowners are held)

What time does the event start? 4pm the event will open with live music starting at 4:30pm.

Is it a ticketed event? The event is FREE but registration is essential, and there will be ticket checking points in operation on the perimeter of the park.

How do I register? You must register for a free ticket online by following the links on our website weavingstoriesofboodja.com or visit our booking platform Humanitix and search for Cowara Bird Story.

Is there anything else happening at the event? We will have live music, kids activities and a fundraiser sausage sizzle available to enjoy in the lead up to our sunset performance. The Year 4 class at Cowaramup Primary School will sing the Welcome Song with Mitch and Viv accompanying on tapping sticks.

Will there be any food or drinks available for purchase? The Cowaramup Primary School P & C will be running a fundraiser sausage sizzle with non-alcoholic beverage for sale. You are more than welcome to bring a picnic to our family friendly event.

What time will the children perform? The Cowara Bird performance will begin at 6:50pm.

How long will the performance last for? Approximately 30 mins.

What time will the event finish? 7:30pm.

How do I get to the venue? It will be best walking or cycling to the venue if possible, as parking is very limited and will still require you to walk/ride across the Pioneer Park and the Bussell Highway.

Where is the best place to park my car? If you can leave your car at home, that would be best but if that is not an option for you, we recommend: The parking lots next to Cowaramup Hall and Duggan Pavilion. Specifically, the overflow parking at Hasluck & Bottrill Streets. Please be safe and do not park illegally as there will be many children attending this event.

What do you recommend I bring to the venue? Bring a picnic blanket, cushion or something to sit on. If you are bringing chairs please set up on the sides or mid/back. We want everyone to be able to see the children perform. Bring something warm as nights can still be cool in November. Bring a picnic! Bring wet weather gear as the performance will go on if it is sprinkling. Bring a torch light or head torch, the walk/ride from the venue after the event may be darker than you expect. Please be responsible at this family event.
